## **Our Solidarity Plan**

#### We stand united in demanding the following

All furloughed and reduced employees should be recalled to their regular positions and have their hours restored by January 1, 2021, and be made whole.

No additional furloughs or reductions in hours should take place/

Faculty and staff who are able to do their work remotely should continue to do so with no loss of pay so long as COVID-19 is a serious threat.

Bargain COVID-related issues jointly.

Any further decisions concerning campus opening or closing, or other covid-related issues, should be made jointly with all of us at the table.











#### Our Solidarity Plan Letter to the Chancellor

Dear Chancellor Subbaswamy,

As members of the University Staff Association, Professional Staff Union, and Massachusetts Society of Professors, we request that you meet with us to discuss plans to fully staff the campus for the remainder of this academic year.

We have just learned the good news that the state legislature has fully funded UMass through the end of the fiscal year. This means that the campus has received \$36.7 million more than the budget projections that were used in the service of obtaining widespread staff furloughs. In addition, student enrollment is significantly higher than projected.

Based on these figures, we believe that it is absolutely possible to 1) reinstate all USA and PSU members who have been placed on indefinite furloughs or had their hours reduced, and 2) establish that there will be no additional furloughs or layoffs of any UMass Amherst employees in the spring semester.

We share your goal of making UMass Amherst one of the best public universities in the country, just as we share your goal of protecting the health and safety of our students, employees, and community. We need to bring back all of our talented, experienced staff to continue our university's mission of excellent teaching, research, and student services.

We appreciate your warm and supportive words for staff and faculty over the course of this pandemic and look forward to having this vital conversation with you, personally. Please respond by Tuesday, November 24 to let us know of your willingness to meet and some dates and times that will work for you in the near future.




