April 8 is a National Day of Action to "Kill the Cuts"!

At the same time, our state-level parent union MTA is sending a delegation today to the MA legislature's Joint Committee on Ways and Means to call for **\$200** million from Fair Share funds to support university research threatened by federal cuts.

Today's day of action builds on years of organizing by MSP and MTA!

The Fair Share Amendment—first conceived by MSP leaders, championed by MTA, and passed by voters in November 2022—created a 4% tax on the portion of a person's annual income above \$1 million and dedicated the funds raised to public education and transportation.

More recently, on March 24, at a MA Joint Committee on Ways and Means hearing, MSP activists distributed leaflets to advocate for the MTA's budget proposal, which demands a reserve of \$200 million from the Fair Share surplus and additional funds from general Fair Share revenue to stave off <u>negative impacts</u> from federal actions. MTA President (and UMass faculty member) Max Page and MSP Co-President Marc Liberatore gave testimony in support of the MTA's budget proposal.
